| LEARNING OUTCOMES             | Knowledge of the outlines of the history of Russian literature in the XXth century and of the critical debate concerning it.  Comprehension of the technical language of the different critical schools.  Ability to autonomously read and contextualize contemporary literary texts.  |
| ASSESSMENT METHODS            | Oral exam with open questions. Legal requirements dictate that the evaluation should be expressed according to a thiry-points method, where 30 stands for a totally satisfactory knowledge of the course syllabus and ability to handle the required analytical tools, any mark inferior to 18 a poor competence, according to which the exam cannot be passed, 18 the minimal competence allowing to pass the exam, and marks from 19 to 29 a satisfactory competence with a decreasing level of flaws. |
