DOCENTE: Prof.ssa ARIANNA DI BELLA Knowledge of the literary terminology with reference to italian culture. The **PREREQUISITES** Student must be able to read the texts mentioned in the programme in complete autonomy LEARNING OUTCOMES Knowledge and understanding: Acquisition of appropriate tools for critical interpretation of a literary work. Knowledge of the different methods of interpretation and cultural-historical periods Acquisition of the tools for the recognition of the most important literary works of the German literary scene. Acquisition ofthe methods for comparing different texts by the same author. Ability to conduct literary research on the selected topics. Ability to enter into the selected authors' historical and literary contexts. Ability to apply knowledge and understanding: Ability to identify the textual elements that characterize every literary-historical period and to recognize the differences and peculiarities in the cultural development of the German-speaking countries from the sixteenth century to the early nineteenth century. Ability to judge: Ability to express personal opinions on the authors and texts of the literaryhistorical period under examination. Communication skills: Ability to take a position concerning the analysis and interpretation of the literary texts under focus as a consequence of a detailed exploration of given documents, and capability to defend one's own opinion. Learning ability: Being able to structurally organize the learned concepts Learning will be evaluated in different ways and different phases: a part of the ASSESSMENT METHODS evaluation will seek to determine the possession of skills, abilities and competences, which are required until that time of the focus on the programme. Five open questions will be proposed and the student will independently formulate the answers (short essays), this check will have a value of 14 points... A second part of the evaluation of learning takes place through a 'Referat' that will test the knowledge of a topic that the student will have to choose autonomously and that the student will expose orally, this check will have a value of 10 points. During the final phase of the learning evaluation the student will have to answer at least three questions about the parts of the programme that during the others phases of learning evaluation have not been verified, this check will have a value of 6 points. The questions tend to verify: a) content knowledge b) processing capacity c) adequate attitude to expose contents orally. Sufficiency will be achieved if the student shows basic knowledge and understanding of the topics. The student will also have to demonstrate presentation and argumentative skills in order to prove his/her knowledge to the examiner. The evaluation is expressed in thirtieths and considers also the results in the different knowledge checks.
