EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	The course aims to provide a coherent view of the social psychology of intergroup relations. The basic functioning of the psychological group will be analyzed. Then we will look at relationships between groups focusing particularly on problematic and conflicting relationships. The different theories and the empirical results achieved in the last decades will be shown in an organic manner. Areas that reflect a consolidated articulation of the foundations of the discipline will be treated, combining interest in current issues of the
	scientific debate with a focus on the classical contributions of social psychology.
