DOCENTE: Prof. FRANCESCO PAOLO MADONIA PREREQUISITES Good knowledge of literary terminology. Knowledge of the evolution of french history and literature in european and north-american contexts **LEARNING OUTCOMES** -Knowledge of french literary history from 1968 to present days. - To acquire proper tools in order to take a critical reading of a literary text and abilities to recognize the textual elements, wich are related with the sociocultural anche philosophical-theological debate of a particular era; - to recognize and to evaluate the position of the authors, the opinions of the researchers and to compare them to the owns; - to communicate and to support clearly the own position to specialist and non specialist audiences: - to adjourn and oriente himself in the offer of new critical tools and in the trasmission of knowledge. - to value the intercultural dimension of a text: - to recognize the themes that characterize the history of French literature from 1968 to the present day. ASSESSMENT METHODS Learning will be evaluated in different ways and in different phases. - "In itinere" test: preparation of a paper on a topic chosen by the student which will be exposed in the classroom on a day previously agreed. - Final evaluation. The student must answer a minimum of three oral questions, concerning the parts of the program not yet tested. Assessments of learning will tend to verify: a) le acquired knowledge, b) the ability to process, c) the possession of adequate exhibition capacity. The final evaluation of the candidates is expressed in thirtieths and is the result of the evaluations obtained during the various learning checks. 30-30 cum laude: excellent knowledge of the topics, excellent property of language, excellent analytical skills, the student is able to apply the knowledge to solve the proposed problems; 26-29: good command of the arguments, full ownership of language, the student is able to apply the knowledge to solve the proposed problems; 24-25: basic knowledge of the main topics, discreet language properties, with limited ability to autonomously apply the knowledge to the solution of the proposed problems; 21-23: the student does not have full mastery of the main topics of teaching but has minimal knowledge; acceptable language property; limited ability to independently apply the acquired knowledge; 18-20: minimum basic knowledge of the topics covered and the technical language, little or no ability to independently apply the acquired knowledge; under 18: the student does not even have a basic knowledge of the contents of the topics covered. **EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES** The student will acquire: knowledge that enhances the previuos understanding of the french historical and cultural context; - ability to apply the knowledge related to differents methodologies of research towards the discussed topics; - ability to evaluate and express opinions about the impact of different cultures on the concerned period.
