Ability to identify the most suitable areas of application for the different types of intervention. Applying knowledge and understanding Ability to outline with autonomy a possible context of intervention with the family, identifying the reference theoretical model, clinical tools and the suitable measures for the evaluation and observation, in reference to the family life cycle and the relative critical event. Making judgements Ability to work independently, with a critical and aware approach, demonstrating to know how to integrate different approach to the clinical study of family with critical and independent thought. Communication Acquisition of skills' description and synthesis and use of an appropriate psychological lexicon. Lifelong learning skills Ability to understand the normative and non-normative family dynamics; ability to identify family contexts of risk and resilience factors; achieving an expertise in scientific literature consultation in the field of family psychodynamics, with particular reference to the new family types. Learning will be assessed by an oral exam which will consist of an interview that ASSESSMENT METHODS is to ascertain the possession of skills and subject knowledge provided by the In particular, questions will regard methods and observation techniques of family contexts, with particular attention to families who need for clinical intervention; the main systemic-relational theories and research tools for new family typologies; the family life cycle, normative and non-normative development tasks and the possible clinical contexts involving the couple and/or the family. The candidate will have to answer at least three questions posed orally, on all parties covered by the program, with reference to the recommended texts. Final assessment aims to evaluate whether the student: has knowledge and understanding about the most important theories and techniques for clinical intervention on families, has acquired interpretive competence and judgment autonomy in the assessment of clinical cases, is able to outline autonomously a possible context of intervention on the family, by identifying the theoretical reference model, the clinical tools and the most suitable evaluation and observation techniques, demonstrates the ability to know normative and paranormal family dynamics and is able to identify the contexts of risk for family and the factors of resilience. The pass mark will be reached when the student shows knowledge and understanding of the subjects at least in general terms; he/she will also have presentation and argumentative skills as to allow the transmission of his/her knowledge to the examiner. Below this threshold, the examination will be insufficient. The more, however, the student will be able to find own connections between the topics of the course and be able to go into detail on the subject of discipline, the more the assessment is positive. The assessment is carried out of thirty. The final vote determination takes into account the following aspects: 1. In-depth knowledge of the subject issues, ability to link the various topics and to refer to the contents of all textbooks and lessons. 2. Achievement of the objectives provided by Dublin descriptors 3. Presence and active participation during the lessons Main objective of the course is the study of theoretical and applicative models **EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES** for clinical intervention with families. It will be deepened the main systemicrelational theories and the various contexts for clinical interventions, in the prevention, evaluation and juridical fields. Starting from the study of the family life cycle, normative and non-normative development tasks will be deepened and it will be explored the possible clinical contexts involving the couple and/or the family in each phase; in particular, the attention will be focused on parenting, couple relationship, new family typologies, risks contexts for children and families.
