PREREQUISITES	Knowledge of a sufficient number of general basics about the history of ideas, about the main periodization of modern and contemporary history, as well as about the main legal concepts.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	Knowledge and ability to understand To know and understand the fundamental notions about Matrimonial Canon Law.
	Ability to apply knowledge and understanding.  To investigate the reasons why the Catholic Church over the course of its history has adopted a set of legal rules, especially in matrimonial subject, and to understand the importance of such a legal heritage in modern reality.
	Personal judgment To have critical awareness of the founding value of Canon Law and of his considerable effect on current secular law.
	Ability to communicate  To communicate the acquired knowledge in a comprehensive and convincing manner also through short simulation tests of canonical processes for the declaration of nullity of marriage.
	Learning skills  To be able to reconstruct the evolution of the main canonical institutions retracing the most significant doctrinal contributions and the foremost judicial trends
ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral final exam - grades on a scale between 18 and 30 cum laude.
	The student's assessment involves an oral test, consisting of an interview where questions are asked about topics included in the course program. The applications will tend to assess whether the student has knowledge and understanding of the subject matter, has acquired interpretative competence and autonomy in the assessment of concrete cases, and has acquired possession of an adequate exhibition capacity.
	The exam consists of an interview aimed at ascertaining the level of knowledge of the topics in the syllabus, the level of command in the specialized language and the ability of the candidate to develop a reasoning aimed at the application of theoretical knowledge to specific cases to be analyzed in order to give possible solutions.  The interview consists of a minimum of three questions.
	The evaluation will take place in compliance to the following evaluation grid:  -excellent 30 -30 cum laude: very good knowledge of the topics, excellent use of language, excellent capacity of analysis; the student has all the competences to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases for which possible solutions are provided, also suggesting multiple alternatives;
	- very good 26-29: good knowledge of the topics, good use of language, good capacity of analysis; the student is sufficiently able to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases for which solutions are provided.
	<ul> <li>good 24-25: Basic knowledge of the main topics, fairly good use of language, the student shows limited ability to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases for which solutions are provided.</li> </ul>
	-satisfactory 21-23: the student does not have complete command of the main teaching topics, although demonstrating he/she possesses the basic knowledge; he/she shows acceptable use of language albeit with a poor ability to adequately apply acquired theoretical knowledge;
	- sufficient 18-20: minimal knowledge of the main teaching topics and technical language; limited or no capacity to adequately apply acquired theoretical knowledge;
	- insufficient outcome: the student does not have an acceptable knowledge of the contents of the various topics of the program.
