LEARNING OUTCOMES	Knowledge and Understanding Students acquire the concept of public sphere, post-democracy, neoliberalism, patriarchy, feminism, gender, vulnerability, and precariousness Applying Knowledge and Understanding Students apply their knowledge to elaborate lectures, papers, and original researches. Students put their knowledge in the contest of the public sphere and communication. Making Judgements Students acquire critical capabilities in applying theory and analyzing the real contests. Communication Students are able to communicate knowledge using specialized language during group discussions, workshops, and exams. Learning Skills Students are enabled to select, analyze, and elaborate knowledge and skills acquired during the lesson and through personal study.
ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral exam, three open questions in three hours, aims to evaluate the learning outcomes: knowledge and understanding, applying knowledge and understanding, making judgments, communication, learning skills. EVALUATION CRITERIA EXCELLENT (30-30 cum laude) Excellent knowledge of the topics, excellent use of language and specialized lexicon, excellent critic capability, and skill to apply acquired knowledge and critic approach in order to carry on context analysis; VERY GOOD (26-29) Good knowledge of the topics, good use of language and specialized lexicon, and good capabilities to apply acquired knowledge in real contexts; GOOD (24-25) Good knowledge of the main topics, fairly good use of language and specialized lexicon, limited skills to apply the knowledge in the real contexts. SATISFACTORY (21-23) Poor knowledge of the main topics, satisfactory use of language and specialized lexicon, poor capabilities to manage acquired knowledge; SUFFICIENT (18-20) Basic knowledge of the main topics, limited use of language and specialized lexicon, limited or none capabilities to apply the acquired knowledge; INSUFFICIENT The Student hasn't got an acceptable knowledge of the topics
