The evaluation of the intermediate test will concur (50%) to the final assessment. In this case, during the final exam, students will be examined on the program of the second module only. Final oral assessment: The oral assessment: The oral assessment is a viva in which knowledge and skills in the field of study are going to be tested. Final notes go from 18 to 30 points. The student is required to answer at least 2 or 3 oral questions regarding the whole program of study with reference to the suggested books.
