<b>PREREQUISITES</b>	Know how to distinguish works of art. Recognize techniques. Know the chronology of cultural phenomena of the medieval and modern eras.
<b>LEARNING OUTCOMES</b>	<p><b>Knowledge and Understanding.</b>  The course is structured in such a way that, at the end of the studies, the student demonstrates both historical and methodological competences for the research and interpretation of artistic production in Italy in the medieval and modern age.</p> <p><b>Ability to apply knowledge and understanding.</b>  The students, at the end of the course, should have the ability to apply the acquired knowledge of understanding and skills in solving problems related to the reading and interpretation of the artistic artifacts produced in Italy between the ninth and eighteenth centuries. These skills are developed through seminar activities, personal study, frontal lessons and guided visits.</p> <p><b>Autonomy of Judgment</b>  At the end of the course of study, students are expected to be able to integrate their knowledge in order to make autonomous judgments which, in addition to reflecting on the proposed artistic themes, can also be based on the geographic and chronological context of the iconographic themes related to the subject.</p> <p><b>Communication skills</b>  The student, at the end of the course, will have to demonstrate that he/she is able to communicate clearly and unambiguously the conclusions reached, with the correct verbal description of a work of art, of the cultural context, as well as the reasons behind them, such as the commission or the iconological interpretation, to interlocutors who are specialists in the field of art history and non-specialists, being therefore able to pass from one communicative register, verbal or written, to another.</p> <p><b>Learning ability</b>  The training during the course will not be considered the point of arrival, but only the set of tools and useful information that allow you to continue your studies in the field in a personal and autonomous way. Therefore, at the end of the course the student will have to be able to carry out an original scientific research work, identifying primary and secondary sources, knowing how to use them with the correct knowledge and according to the right weight of each source.</p>
<b>ASSESSMENT METHODS</b>	<p>In order to verify in self-evaluation the know-how, that is the application of the acquired knowledge, the elaboration of a cataloguing form is foreseen, consisting in the application of aspects inherent to the discipline, such as the iconographic recognition and the reading of the stylistic code. The methodology of the elaboration of the card will be discussed during the frontal lessons, it will be carried out at the end of the lessons and it will be object of the final evaluation. The final exam will be oral and will consist in an interview, in which the candidate will have to answer at least three questions, in order to verify the possession of the skills and knowledge of the course; the evaluation will be expressed in thirtieths. The final overall evaluation during the oral will be obtained from the analysis of the following indicators:</p> <p>1) Basic knowledge of the topics covered and limited ability to elaborate knowledge and correlation between the various topics for the study of Medieval and Modern Art History. Sufficient ability to analyze the topics presented. Limited autonomy of judgment and exposure to the procedures followed (grade 18-21).</p> <p>2) Good knowledge of the topics covered and good ability to elaborate knowledge and correlation between the various topics for the study of Medieval and Modern Art History. Good ability to analyze the topics presented. Good autonomy of judgment and exposure of the procedures followed (grade 22-24)</p> <p>3) In-depth knowledge of the topics covered and more than good ability to process knowledge and correlation between the various topics for the study of Medieval and Modern Art History. Good ability to analyze the topics presented. Autonomy of judgment and exposition of the procedures followed more than good (grade 25-27)</p> <p>4) Excellent knowledge of the topics covered, excellent and ready ability to process knowledge and correlation between the various topics for the study of Medieval and Modern Art History. Excellent ability to analyze the stylistic phenomena presented. Excellent autonomy of judgment and exposure; contextualization and accurate iconographic reading of the work of art (grade 28-30)</p> <p>5) Excellent knowledge of the topics covered, excellent and very prompt ability to process knowledge in order to apply it to specific aspects of the study of Medieval and Modern Art History. Excellent capacity of analysis of stylistic phenomena presented. Excellent autonomy of judgment and exposure; contextualization, exact iconographic reading of the work of art and its iconological interpretation (vote 30 with honors).</p>

**EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES OF THE MODULE**

The purpose of the module is to provide the basic contents of the discipline and its method of study required for the student's scientific and cultural training, regarding the abilities in the field of visual arts, and the historical and artistic heritage. Specifically, the module aims to provide historical-scientific and theoretical-technical ability in the field of the history of medieval art. This module is intended to provide a method for approaching the study of the history of medieval art by contextualizing the stylistic phenomena in the historical-cultural period of reference, particularly in the national context. It is also intended to rationalize the proposed cognitive path from the recognition of materials, techniques and typology to continue with iconographic reading, understanding of stylistic code and iconological interpretation.
