## DOCENTE: Prof. MATTEO MANDALA'

PREREQUISITES	Basic knowledge of the discipline, in particular related to the civil and religious history of Europe and Italy from the Middle Ages to the present day.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	Knowledge and capacities for comprehension Knowledge of the main concepts of "diaspora", "minority" and "religion" with direct reference to the birth and formation of "religious identities" in the various territorial contexts (national and otherwise), multi-religious and multicultural in Europe and in particular in Italy. Diachronic understanding of the causes of diasporas and synchronic analysis of the rights of "religious minorities". Interpretation of the legal status of each minority group and analysis of the degree of implementation of rights concerning the variety of geo-cultural articulations. Knowledge and study of the European Union legislation on the subject.
	Capacity to apply store of knowledge and comprehension Ability to identify the phenomenon of religious minorities about historical and contemporary legal dynamics.
	Autonomous thinking; Use of methods of analysis and notions of the history of religions, sociology of religions, cultural anthropology and legal traditions of religious minorities to autonomously prepare analyzes also in a comparative context.
	Communication capabilities Be able to establish valid communication strategies during the acquisition of historical-geographical and typological data relating to the religious phenomenon
	Comprehension abilities. Teaching principles and tools of structuring scientific research. (proofreading, editing and consultation of bibliographies; finding of written and oral information; application of historical and comparative methods.)
ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral test: aims to assess the knowledge, notions and concepts acquired over the course. Taking heed of the results of the teaching process, open- and half- open stimuli are forwarded to the student, structured to allow the student to reply autonomously and reflect over the theoretical tools and the method used in the study. The oral test consists of a talk testing the knowledge of topics discussed on during the course and individual capabilities for synthesis. The highest mark is 30. The student will reply as a minimum to two or three oral questions, covering all parts of the programme and referring to the additional literature. Questions will assess: a)knowledge and comprehension; b)absorbing capabilities c)expounding capabilities d)autonomous thinking Marks
