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PREREQUISITES	General knowledge of ancient sources and critical methodologies; understanding of the main questions about political events, socio-cultural phenomena, processes of transformation of Roman history from the beginnings to the Late Antiquity.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	 Knowledge and understanding: Knowledge of categories of Latin epigraphy (alphabet, onomastic, formulae, reading of texts, chronology) and understanding of documentary value of inscriptions. Applying knowledge and understanding: Ability to access the ancient epigraphical sources and the bibliographical references to analyze the historical phenomena treated. Making judgements: Ability to gather and interpret epigraphic texts and to inform judgements in the field of Roman society making comparison between epigraphical data and the evidence of other documentary sources. Communication: Ability to communicate information and critical questions and solutions clearly and through an appropriate language to both specialist and non-specialist audiences. Learning skills: Developing of those learning skills that are necessary to continue to undertake further study about specific issues in the field of Roman history with a high degree of autonomy, particularly though epigraphy.
ASSESSMENT METHODS	 Final oral assessment: The oral assessment is a viva in which knowledge and skills in the field of study are going to be tested. Final notes go from 18 to 30 points. The student is required to answer at least 2 or 3 oral questions regarding the whole program of study with reference to the suggested books. EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	Methodologies of Latin epigraphy, knowledge of categories of Latin epigraphy (alphabet, onomastic, formulae, reading of texts, chronology), critical analyses of inscriptions in historical context, to understand the documentary value of epigraphy in relationship with other typologies of ancient sources, as means of public an private communication of Roman society. The investigation of a specific issue, the empire of Commodus, aims at applying these methodologies to political, social and cultural questions through the modern scientific debate.
TEACHING METHODS	Frontal teaching and discussion on ancient texts and document, by power points too; active student participation is encouraged. Exercises on ancient texts. The dossier of documents will be available on line during the course.
