LEARNING OUTCOMES	<p>Knowledge and understanding capability: Students gain a general knowledge of the international law on the use of force.</p> <p>Applying knowledge and comprehension capability: Students gain the ability the ability to employ their new skills and to and increase their knowledge through the analysis of real cases of the international practice. To this end, students acquire the necessary methodological instruments to carry out a research of legal and judicial and quasi-judicial international decisions.</p> <p>Making judgments: Students develop a critical approach towards the main topics of the international law on the use of force and are able to elaborate autonomous proposals in order to find out the solution of relevant legal problems. Thanks to the acquired critical capabilities, students are able to develop an autonomous reasoning, with regard to both real cases and scholarly opinions.</p> <p>Communicating skills: Students gain awareness of the exact meaning of specific legal terminology of the international law on the use of force. They are able to deal with a controversial legal issue in the field, and expose its main aspects in a professional manner. They are able to illustrate – either orally or in written form – a specific legal problem, and to conduct detailed researches in the field of the law of international organisations. They are able to use web instruments and electronic data banks.</p> <p>Capacity Learning Students gain a general knowledge of the international law on the use of force and a methodology which will provide them with the capability to undertake further specialist studies in the field. They gain the appropriate methodological skills to enhance and update their knowledge in relevant professional contexts</p>
