LEARNING OUTCOMES	KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING The student must have a good knowledge and understandingskillsin the field of legal studies of cultural property legislation , in order to demonstrate appropriate skills in the conservation, enhancement, use of cultural goods and on the discipline of the powers of authorization, supervision and sanctions of Publics Administrations. In particular, the student must demonstrate the ability to correlate the knowledge and skills acquired in the fields of cultural goods to the solution of concrete cases. APPLYING KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING Knowledge and understanding will be achieved throught the analysis of selcted judgments of the Administrative courts and the study of the distinct types of administrative measures regarding the protection, use, enhancement and digitization of cultural heritage. MAKING JUDGEMENTS The student will have to demonstrate the autonomy and critical capacity of analysis of regulatory discipline, administrative cases and related legal institutes. The autonomy of judgment will be stimolated and developed, during the course of studies, through a continuous critical discussion of concrete cases with the help of the didactic manuals and regulatory texts in force. COMMUNICATION SKILLS The student will be in hurry to communicate, in a clear and articulated way, the notions and legal knowledge about cultural heritage; and will have to communicate effectively using the technical-legal language. LEARNING SKILLS The student will develop learning skills suitable for further research with a higher degree of autonomy, in such a way as to enable him to effectively undertake a second-level study or to enter the world of work with the knowledge and legal skills acquired on the protection and innovative management profiles of cultural heritage, including the use of the image of the cultural property, .
ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral exams - The oral exam consists of two/three questions concerning the course subjects; it aims to ascertain the student's knowledge of the course subjects, how appropriately s/he expresses her/himself, and her/his problem solving abilities. Marks: 30/30 e lode s/he expresses herself/himself with extremely clear and effective language, excellent knowledge of the course subjects, good analytical and problem solving skills; 26-29 s/he expresses herself/himself with clear and effective language, good knowledge of the course subjects, fine analytical and problem solving skills; 24-25 s/he expresses herself/himself properly, has basic knowledge of the course subjects and acceptable problem solving skills; 21-23 imperfect knowledge of the course subjects, low analytical and problem solving skills; 18-20 minimal knowledge of the course subjects; INSUFFICIENTE the student has unsatisfactory knowledge of the course subjects

The course aims to acquire advanced and updated knowledge of the legal discipline and powers of public administrations on public and private cultural assets, in the current expansive evolution of digitization applied to the management of cultural heritage and the peculiar lines of action of public policies established in the PNRR 2021-2026.
