ASSESSMENT METHODS	<p>Final oral exam; presentation of an extended essay in written form on a study case developed during the course. The students will be able to answer some general questions on theoretical issues and on the main topics of the course. They especially will be able to recognize, explain and discuss monuments, artifacts, images and topographic contexts inhering the archaeology and history of Greek art, using a proper lexicon. The exam aims to verify and evaluate the degree of achievement of the learning outcomes of the course, according to the following grid:</p> <p>level of knowledges and competences barely adequate- 18-21/30 level adequate, but with failures (yet not overly important) in the way of describing and contextualizing phenomena, artifacts, monuments- 22-25/30; level satisfactory, with a few flaws- 26-28/30 level fully satisfactory -29-30/30 level excellent- 30/30 cum laude</p>
EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	<p>The course is designed for students with some good previous knowledge of Greek archaeology and history of Greek art (bachelor level), who want to engage more deeply with several key topics of the discipline. They will be able to adopt a critical approach and to consider the complexity of the evidences and the modern bibliography, gaining a sound methodology in the study of Greek material culture and art. The students will be encouraged to participate in seminar lessons and in visits to monuments and museums.</p> <p>The course aims to introduce the students to an in-depth analysis of the main topics of Greek art, imagery and architecture, and to allow them a fuller understanding of the sites, contexts and agencies, through a key theme which will be considered from diverse points of view and approaches.</p> <p>This year, the topic which will deepened concerns: houses and urban culture in the Greek world from the Early Iron Age to the Hellenistic period- settlements, buildings and architectural forms, decorations, functions.</p>
