## **DOCENTE: Prof. MATTEO DI FIGLIA PREREQUISITES** Knowledge of geography of Europe, America, Asia and Africa. Ability at using an General knowledge of history of XIX and XX centuries. LEARNING OUTCOMES ECTS credits for this course are awarded to students who: Knowledge and understanding: • have demonstrated knowledge and understanding that is founded upon and extends and/or enhances that typically associated with the first cycle, and that provides a basis or opportunity for originality in developing and/or applying ideas, often within a research context; Applying knowledge and understanding: • can apply their knowledge and understanding, and problem solving abilities in new or unfamiliar environments within broader (or multidisciplinary) contexts related to their field of study; Making judgements: • have the ability to integrate knowledge and handle complexity, and formulate judgements with incomplete or limited information, but that include reflecting on social and ethical responsibilities linked to the application of their knowledge and judgements; • have the learning skills to allow them to continue to study in a manner that may be largely self-directed or autonomous. Communication: • can communicate their conclusions, and the knowledge and rationale underpinning these, to specialist and non specialist audiences clearly and unambiguously. Knowledge and understanding: knowledge of history of XIX and XX centuries and understanding of the main political, economic and social shifts. Applying knowledge and understanding: connections among the topics studied during the course: Making judgements: definition of interpretative theories proposed by the historians; Communication: definition, through and appropriate vocabulary, of the historiographical topics, by focusing on their main and characterizing elements and their context. Students attending the course will have the opportunity to verify their learning ASSESSMENT METHODS progress by means of an intermediate written test concerning the history of XIX century (see bibliography, point 1, first part of the book). If passed, this will also constitute a 40% exemption on the final exam. The remaining 60% will be evaluated by means of an oral exam which will take place at the end of the course and which will focus on the history of XX century (see bibliography, point 1, second part of the book) and some methodological issues (see bibliography, points 2 and 3). .
