LEARNING OUTCOMES	Knowledge and ability of understanding At the end of the course students will have their ability to understand and analyze poetic, dramatic and narrative texts belonging to different cultural- historical contexts through different critical approaches. Particular attention will be paid to the study of auto/biographical writing (autobiographies, biographies, memoirs, journals) through the works in the reading list with references to possible teaching practices. Such knowledge and skills will be achieved through participation in lectures and guided and individual study also aimed at the preparation of a teaching module to be exposed orally in the classroom.
	Ability to apply knowledge and comprehension Students will have to refine the analytical and conceptual tools and methodologies for interpreting the works studied in the original language, their form and structure, taking into account possible teaching applications. The ability to apply literary knowledge to teaching will be achieved through critical analysis of the texts examined during the classroom activities and proposed for individual study and preparation of the teaching module.
	Ability in autonomy of judgment The course aims to provide the tools needed to understand and critically analyse the literary works in the program in a diachronic perspective with autonomy of judgment that will be verified through the evaluation of the teaching module presented in the classroom.
	Communicative abilities Students will need to demonstrate that they are able to express contents, information and critical thinking clearly and autonomously in English.
	Ability of learning Students will acquire advanced learning methods and tools; they will also be able to create small teaching modules with attention not only to the transmission of knowledge but also to the best means of communication to be refined in any subsequent studies dedicated to teaching.
ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral group presentation of a lesson plan and oral examination aimed at assessing the knowledge of the topics dealt with in the course, the mastery of specific vocabulary, the analytic skills, the ability to apply autonomously the acquired knowledge. Students will be asked at least 2 questions in English and they will be asked to read and translate into Italian and analyze excerpts from the literary texts included in the reading list. Students who do not attend classes will send their lesson plan via email at least 10 days before their exam.
	Marks. 30 - 30 e lode: excellent knowledge of the topics of the course and critical comprehension of the theories and critical approaches studied; excellent skills of applying the acquired knowledge and full mastery of the most effective tools and approaches to analyse the English literary text; fluency and confident use of the literary language in English; outstanding ability to organise the topics of the course autonomously and in an original way. 27 – 29: thourough knowledge of the topics of the course and critical comprehension; good skills in applying the acquired knowledge and information and good mastery of the most effective tools and approaches to analyse the English literary text; nearly fluency and use of the literary language in English; ability to organise the topics of the course autonomously and in an original way. 24 – 26: fundamental knowledge of elements and general concepts topics of the course; basic skills in applying instruments and method of analysis of the English literary text; average use of the literary language in English; basic ability to organise the topics of the course. 21-23: the student does not fully master the main concepts and topics of the course but has minimum knowledge; acceptable use of literary language; limited ability to apply acquired knowledge autonomously; 18 – 20: Minimum knowledge of the main topics of the course; Minimum skills in applying autonomously the acquired knowledge; Minimum use of the English literary language; Minimum ability to organise the topics of the course.
EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	The course aims to provide students with analysis tools with en eye not only to the understanding and interpreting of the literary texts in the program and their historical and socio-cultural contexts, but also to build a basis of the teaching methods that can be used in high schools. The lectures will be held mainly in English and extracts from the works included in the programme will be read, translated into Italian and examined in the classroom. Different teaching methods will be explained in the classroom with a view to possible further studies in English and Education.
