PREREQUISITES	A basic knowledge of Musical Theory and Music History is required.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	<p>Knowledge of the history of Opera.</p> <p>Comprehension of dramaturgical techniques in musical works.</p> <p>Ability to discuss specific examples of musical theater in relation to musical genres, morphology and historical background.</p> <p>Ability to introduce younger students to the listening of operas.</p>
ASSESSMENT METHODS	The examination consists of an oral interview designed to test knowledge of the topics in the program and to assess the student's autonomy in learning. The reading of the recommended texts should be accompanied by careful and repeated listening to the works in the program, together with the reading of the libretto. Musicology students are requested to accompany listening by reading the score of the indicated pieces. Each student is required to know and be able to comment on the musical excerpts in the program and to elaborate on a opera of his/her choice, agreeing on the bibliography with the lecturer. The final grade will be from 18/30 to 30/30 cum laude.
EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	The course aims at introducing students to the understanding of musical theater. It will focus on the concept of musical dramaturgy, taking into exam one or more examples of operas, also discussing their historical context. Moreover, some lessons will be dedicated to the teaching of the History of Musical Theater in different educational contexts.
TEACHING METHODS	Lectures. Watching or listening to operas. Analysis of musical scores.
