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C1 LEVEL OF FRENCH **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

The expected results, defined on the basis of the parameters indicated by the five Dublin descriptors, are based on the indications provided by the CEFR for the C1 + / C2 level.

KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING

At the end of the course, the student is expected to acquire solid and in-depth theoretical knowledge on the concepts developed, who can distinguish the different text genres, understand without particular effort an intervention, a conversation, a film or a television broadcast of a certain length, discriminating expressions, terms and ways of the spoken language and reading any type of text of any length.

ABILITY TO APPLY KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING

Thanks to the various activities proposed during the course, the student will have to be able to apply knowledge and understanding, that is, to be able to manage communication by pertinently using the learned specialized lexicon and complex grammatical structures of the French language, to draft complex texts and professionals in French, to master the tools of speech analysis and rhetorical argumentation with a certain aisance. He will be able to coordinate and interpret the data acquired in the varied and complex context of French linguistics, the various linguistic registers and in particular argot, familiar and informal language. He will be able to recognize and understand word games in French, through linguistic nuances and cultural references. It will develop the listening and understanding skills of the language of contemporary French films; understanding of written texts of specialized languages; ' to translate complex texts with word games and cultural references, specialized texts, reflection on dubbing and subtitling. Will be able to compare and analyze translations of texts relating to the topics covered. students will be able to make and present judgments and propose alternative personal translations. metalinguistic reflections.

AUTONOMY OF JUDGMENT

At the end of the course, the student will have to demonstrate that he has developed critical skills that enable him to analyze and evaluate complex texts and authentic documents that use different registers and styles and technical terminology, to coherently structure and develop his own point of view, to summarize and criticize complex texts.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS

At the end of the course, the student must acquire the communication skills described by the CEFR for the level C1 + / C2,

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES	The course aim is to provide a method of approaching the study of the discipline of the French language and the study of the French language through a diversified path that takes into account the appearance of a playful and communicative language. This course will build awareness and knowledge of the variety of languages inside and outside the Hexagon within the Francophonie. It will deepen the metalinguistic awareness with particular reference to the diatonic, diastratic and diaphasic of contemporary French varieties. The level of language to reach for the students will be the one defined as a C1 level in the Common European Framework of Reference: use of language to develop complex and specialized topics. The course is divided in two sections: 1) translation for cinema: dubbing and subtitling. 2) specialized translation French and Italian texts of specialized topics. Slang, colloquial language and slang. puns, cultural references and opportunity 'to translate them in LA. They will analyze mostly 'French films and a few Italian films dialect. Specialized translation. Examples of comparing translation. Translation for cinema: dubbing and subtitling, practical examples and comparisons. The teacher provides an alternative program, on request, to be agreed individually, for students who cannot attend courses
TEACHING METHODS	lectures, tutorials and laboratory .As part of the 120 hours of self-study, attendance of "lettorato" and supplementary teaching activities is recommended
