PREREQUISITES	Adequate knowledge of general notions concerning modern and contemporary history as well as the major legal concepts; adequate knowledge of English language.
LEARNING OUTCOMES	<p>Knowledge and understanding: the course aims to provide methodological tools and theoretical foundations of Italian public law, through the analysis of constitutional legal systems.</p> <p>Applying knowledge and understanding: the course aims to apply knowledge and methodology acquired during the course to analyse and to interpret legal texts or case law.</p> <p>Making judgements: the course's aim is to provide ability to seek and to analyse data and information, which shall be used to resolve legal problems. The course aims to develop in students the ability to integrate the gained knowledge through the Public law analysis, in order to assess the applications and the legal implications of cases or judgements.</p> <p>Communication: the course's aim is to develop the ability to communicate comprehensively, using an appropriate legal terminology. It also aims to improve the ability to make connections with other subjects, arguing clearly the results of the study.</p> <p>Lifelong learning skills: the course aims to enable students to acquire knowledge and understanding of the theoretical and methodological tools of public law, in order to be able to proceed on their own to the analysis of case studies and research.</p>
ASSESSMENT METHODS	<p>The final exam will be oral. An intermediate written exam will take place, on voluntary basis.</p> <p>The written examination aims at verifying the possession of the required knowledge and skills.</p> <p>The aim of the exam is to know whether students have gained skills and knowledges, as well as critical thinking on the issues analyzed during the lessons. The written examination will be a comprehensive set of clear, open-ended questions (minimum of 2 questions).</p> <p>Questions will be drafted as to help in comparing results with the following evaluation grid. The result of the written examination will be taken into account in scoring the final result of the examination process but will not preclude the admission to the oral examination.</p> <p>The oral examination will be an interview on the topics described in the course programme. The interview consists of a minimum of three questions.</p> <p>The final evaluation of each candidate will take into account both the results of the written and oral examination and the acquisition of learning outcomes is assessed in thirtieths.</p> <p>The evaluation of the oral examination will be made on the basis of following grid.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-Excellent 30 -30 cum laude: good knowledge of the topics, excellent property 'language, excellent capacity of analysis ; the student is 'able to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed. He/she is also able to properly argue possible solution, including multiple alternatives- Very good 26-29: good knowledge of the topics, good properties 'of language, good capacity' analytical; the student is 'able to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed. The students is able to adequately apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analysed- Good 24-25: Basic knowledge of the main topics, good property of language, the student shows limited ability' to apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analyzed- Satisfactory 21-23: the student does not show that complete command of the main teaching topics, although showing to know the basic knowledges; he/she shows satisfactory property of language albeit with a poor ability' to adequately apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analyzed- Sufficient 18-20: minimal knowledge of the main teaching and technical language issues, limited or no capacity to adequately apply theoretical knowledge to real cases which are proposed to be analyzed- Insufficient outcome: the student does not have an acceptable knowledge of the contents of the various topics on the agenda

The student must achieve the goal of being able to evaluate the constitutionality of a law and understand the current order of the public authorities, in the light of the legal globalization and the European legal order. The development of the ability to use the technical language of this specialized discipline. Particular attention will be paid to the fallout of the general discipline on the sector of the fundamental rights and the civil liberties.</p>
