<b>ASSESSMENT METHODS</b>	<p>Oral assessment: The oral assessment is a viva in which knowledge and skills in the field of study are going to be tested. Final notes go from 18 to 30 points. The student is required to answer at least 2 or 3 oral questions regarding the whole program of study with reference to the suggested books. <b>EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES</b>	<p>According to the aims of the master's degree in Pedagogical Sciences, which intends to provide students with knowledge and skills in the fields of education and training, the aim of the course is to offer students key and critical tools:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-to become more familiar with the nature of philosophical investigation, and to be able to discuss acquired knowledge using proper and specialized language and terms;</li> <li>-to rediscover the horizons and styles that are characteristic of philosophical research, taking into account the contemporary debate on its epistemological identity and cultural value;</li> <li>-to investigate the theoretical relevance and the ethical-existential scope of philosophical questions, highlighting their relationship with scientific knowledge, religious experience and political commitment, and above all with the pedagogical context and the educational practice;</li> <li>-to explore the aims, objectives, methods of philosophical teaching, following both historical and thematic lines, examining the different contemporary models of philosophical rationality.</li> </ul> <p>The aim of the course, entitled "Hospitality" is to address the theme of the other in the relationship of hospitality, which radicalises the relationship between subject and object by enhancing the issue of passivity.</p>
