ASSESSMENT METHODS	competences Final oral assessment: The final oral assessment is a viva in which knowledge and skills in the field of study are going to be tested. Final pass marks go from 18 to 30 points cum laude. The student is required to answer at least 2 or 3 oral questions regarding the whole program of study with reference to the suggested books. Questions shall assess the knowledge of the main approaches of the current political- philosophical debate (republicanism, liberalism, multiculturalism, feminism, post- colonial studies. theories of justice, the critical theory of the Frankfurt School and, more specifically, A. Honneth's recent socialist proposal) and Quentin Skinner's approach to both political languag's issue and history of ideas. In order to pass the exam with 18/30 student must show basic knowledge of the programm and being able to demonstrate sufficient critical approach to the current debates. In order to achieve an overall score of 30/30 the student must demonstrate excellent knowledge of all the topics included in the program, full competence of the specific lexicon and a confidence in critically approaching the contemporary debates
