EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES OF THE MODULE

This module of the course aims at putting the student in a position to take over the operation mode of the system of private international law, by analyzing goals, structure, problems and solutions specific of this legal branch.

A first part of this module will be devoted to the study of the problems that give rise to the need of the systems of private international law; to the various legal theories that have been put forward; to the evolution that, throughout history, has affected the concept of conflict of laws, determining the choice of different legal instruments, in order to address the needs arising from the trans-nationality of some specific cases.

The course will focus then on the Italian system of private international law. In particular, the main problems relating to the interpretation and application of the key institutions of private international law and its 'operating rules' will be dealt.

During the course, the main rules concerning this subject matter will be analyzed in detail: international rules, EU rules, and Italian norms, with a specific focus on the Italian Law n. 218 of 1995.
