	A written paper on one of the topics should be delivered to the teacher three days before the exam.	
	In both cases the teacher will consider the oral and written proficiencies, knowledge of the topics and the ability to provide autonomous considerations about the subject. Students should answer at least to three questions. Full marks will be if the students will prove: a) knowledge of every topics in the syllabus, b) advanced processing capacity, c) excellent presentation skills.

60	Five troubles for those who write the truth. The work of Bertolt Brecht between literature, theater and new media The course has a monographic nature and aims to provide students with a reconstruction of the figure of Bertolt Brecht through a deep analysis of his work. We will concentrate on different aspects of Brecht's works: poetical writing, prose, dramatic texts and essays. The common thread will be the concept of "estrangement", a concept that goes beyond the field of theater to become a criterion of interpretation of the reality. A complex and contradictory reality that can not be understood nor be modified through the categories of realism and that needs a heuristic method able to grasping dialectically and at the same time communicate its inherent contradictions.
