ASSESSMENT METHODS	<p>The learning assessment will take account of the presentation of case-studies by the students during the course as well as final oral test. Students who were not able to attend the course are required to give a presentation of a case study during the oral examination.</p> <p>Final oral assessment: The discussion based oral assessment aims to test all aspects of knowledge and skills in the field of study.
