PREREQUISITI	No prerequisite required.
RISULTATI DI APPRENDIMENTO ATTESI	At the end of the course the student is expected to identify the main legal aspects that characterize the relationship between family issues and the use of modern technology, in terms of application of the traditional legal categories to the new modern technological realities. INDIVIDUAL JUDGMENT AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS: student should also be able to critically analyze the various topics addressed through the use of an appropriate English technical-legal vocabulary. LEARNING CAPACITY: Ability to update and consult through scientific publications in the field.
VALUTAZIONE DELL'APPRENDIMENTO	The exam consists of: -An oral test at the end of the course. -There will also be 2 written tests in itinere which will count 25% each in the finale grade (50% the 2 written tests and 50% the oral exam). -These exercises will consist of the resolution of 2 study cases where the student uses the knowledge and notions learned during the lessons held up to that moment. -The final evaluation, expressed in thirtieths, is based on the knowledge of the topics (as indicted above), on the ability to connect them and on the critical analysis of the different legal situations addressed, both in theory and using the case law studied. -EXCELLENT (30-30 cum laude) if the student will show excellent knowledge of the topics, excellent language skills, good analytical skills and application of knowledge to solve the proposed problems; -VERY GOOD (26-29) if the student will show good command of the topics covered, full language skills and be able to apply the knowledge to solve the proposed problems; -GOOD (24-25) if the student shows basic knowledge of the main topics, good language skills, limited ability to autonomously apply the knowledge to the solution of the proposed problems; -MORE THAN SATISFACTORY (20-23) if the student shows not full mastery of the main topics but has a good knowledge of them, satisfactory language skills, poor ability to autonomously apply the acquired knowledge; -SATISFACTORY (18-19) if the student will show minimum basic knowledge of the main subjects of the teaching and technical language, minimum ability to apply the acquired knowledge; -FAILED if the student does not have an acceptable knowledge of the contents
OBIETTIVI FORMATIVI	of the topics covered in the teaching. Knowledge of the main key concepts of family law related to technology, with particular attention to the international perspective. Understanding of the overall legal framework in relation to the most recent tech devices. Use of appropriate technical legal English terminology to describe and solve also practical cases.
ORGANIZZAZIONE DELLA DIDATTICA	The course takes place in the fall semester (1) with lessons in presence (in distance learning mode if the pandemic so requires) and the active participation of the students. Opportunities for group practice for students can also be provided according to the number of students enrolled.
TESTI CONSIGLIATI	The material for the course: - scholar articles, slides and other useful material will be uploaded in the web page of the course students will have the possibility also of consulting some text books later indicated and collocated in the library (in consideration of the extremely recent core topic of the course, we will indicate the most recent text books published in the next months).
